

## Some Alabama Death Certificates

Sent by Brenda Carrington sometime ago. Editor did not see photocopies, only these brief notes.

#### Year 1908

Sarah Rose, born in Virginia, died 25 June 1908 in Fayette County, Alabama. Housewife, 74, daughter of Wm. B. Jordan b. Va. and Mary Jordan b. Va. Sarah buried in Fayette Ceme. in Fayette, Alabama.

Cert. #5:252. Nice Rose d. 5 Apr. 1908 in Lauderdale Co., Ala. of consumption. Housekeeper, 51, dau. of Joseph Cooper b. Tenn. and Mrs. Joseph Cooper b. Tenn.

Cert. #9:150: Caldonie Rose d. 8 Mar. 1908 in Walker Co., Ala., housewife, 28, married, dau. of R. W. Cain b. Walker Co., Ala and Sarah Cain b. same. Caldonie was buried Liberty Hill Ceme.

#### Year 1909

Cert. 1:29, Mollie Rose, 3, d. 26 Oct. 1909 in Autauga Co., Ala., dau. of Nord Rose b. Ala and Joseph---? Walker b. Ala.

Cert #14:337: Henry Rose d. 23 Feb. 1909 Mobile, Ala, b. Dallas Co., Ala. Homicide.

Cert #18:221: Paul Rose d. 10 Oct. 1909 Perry Co., Ala, mar, age 25, farmer, son of Jas. Rose b. Ala. and Mary Rose b. Ala. Bur. Lacey Ceme.

Death Certificates are valuable finding aids. Not only do they furnish family information but the fact that the death date is included enables us to search for an obituary. Try the town or city in which the ancestor died and ask the library if they will search for an obituary. Or, check online!

SOME CASE FILES

Abstracted by editors at the National Archives. Part of Record Group 49, these are case files that precede the issuance of a patent. The case files can sometimes offer clues by the name of neighbors, those who knew the applicant for many years, etc. This set of records is very underused but full of potential clues on a family.

Signed: Thomas J. Baker, Ephraim Reagan. --? Feb. 1843.

Affidavit: of Grandeson Greenwood and W[alter] P. Macfarland regarding James Rose settlement. Dated: 25? Mar. 1844.

Receiver's Receipt, Military Bounty Land Act, Receiver's Office at Huntsville, [Ala.], Dec. 31, 1852, received from Edward N. Thompson of Morgan Co., Ala., 54 cents, in full for 43/100 of NE of SW 1/4 Sec. 13 Twp. 6 R 5 West being excess in said tract over the area located in virtue of Military Land Warrant No. 34095 in favor of Nancy Ann Rose. [Note that this mentions Military Land Warrant.] [This does not appear to be the Nancy who married Bennett Rose but could be related.]

## Descendant of John and Hannah (Addleman) Rose of Greene County, Pennsylvania



Sebastian "Bass" Cabot Rose was a descendant of John and Hannah (Addleman) Rose of Greene County, Pennsylvania. This pictures he and his wife Olive Mooney who were married at Waynesburg, Pennsylvania on October 9, 1893 according to the announcement in the newspaper. She is identified as the daughter of Thomas Mooney, same county.

"Bass" Rose was the son of Eli<sup>3</sup> Rose (Jacob<sup>2</sup>, John<sup>1</sup>). Eli was born 31 May 1831 (g.s.), in Pennsylvania, and died 14 May 1917 (g.s.). He is buried Claughton Chapel Ceme. near Kirby, Greene County. He married 1st, according to his obituary (see below), to Elizabeth Kiger who was born 10 November 1832 (g.s.). She died 23 February 1899 (g.s.) and is buried with her husband. She was the daughter of Benjamin Kiger. He married 2nd, according to the same obituary, to Mrs. Elsie ( ) Willard, who died in 1816.

This family is part of Group K of the DNA project. This is a large group of Roses which ties in Long Island, New York but the exact ties between them are yet to be determined. The Ezekiel Rose and the Tychicus Rose families of Washington County, Pennsylvania are also part of this group.


MARRIAGES FROM THE COURTHOUSE

Copied by editors at the courthouse in Pulaski, Tennessee. This county was interesting in that there were more than one early Rose family who lived there, but unconnected. For instance, Abner Rose (editor's family) lived there for a time as did Francis M. Rose (member Terry L. Rose's family) and the Brunswick County, Virginia family of Col. William Rose. DNA shows these three families to be unrelated.

## Enlistment Papers: U.S. Regular Army



Ed. note: Remember that Regular Army records are not the same as records of the U.S. Volunteers. The records with which we are all familiar such as Revolutionary pension records, Compiled Military Service Records, etc. do not exist for the U.S. Regulars. Instead, we rely largely on the enlistment papers and a few other sources.

What if your ancestor joined the army at a very young age? Have you thought of getting his enlistment papers which should show parental consent?

This collection has not been microfilmed. The records are textual and filed alphabetically and referrred to in Prelininary Inventory 17, Entry 91, in "Preliminary Inventory of the Records of the Adjutant General's Office" at the National Archives in Washington D.C.


The example shown here is for Charles Rose who enlisted at age thirteen at West Point in 1929. Nancy Cashman and John Cashman gave consent. Nancy was probably his mother, remarried, though it would need to be verified.

From other records we know his brother also enlisted; these very young boys were drummers and later re-enlisted for several terms.

Sales: Sept. 13, 1839, included sales to Henry Rose for first choice bee stand and another identical item; W. Wheeler, O. Cromwell, John Litterall, A. Dickerson, Russel Bailes, James Denley, Elizabeth Goins, J. Osbornne?, James Goins, Henry Rose (again), W. E. Thompson, Nancy Rose, Beverly Haydon, Henry Rose (again), and Hannah Rose, for a total sales of \$225.50.This was retd. by the adm. Jan. 13, 1840. [The reverse indicates this is also rec. Bk E p 203].

NOTE: THE PAPERS IN THIS ESTATE ARE EXTREMELY IMPORTANT. BY LISTING HENRY ROSE, WE CAN BE SURE THAT WILLIAM H. ROSE (SEE DEED BOOK N PP 452-453 NOT ONLY HAD THE MIDDLE NAME OF HENRY, BUT THAT HE WAS KNOWN AS HENRY ROSE.

#### **NEWS IN BRIEF**

Several years ago from D. Stricklin who thought Roses might be interested in Samuel Rose (1767-1804). She found that Sir. Thomas Lawrence had painted Rose's portrait as mentioned in a brochure of the exhibit published in a catalogue 216 of the Royal Academy of Arts Diploma Gallery, London, 1961. The catalog shows it is a canvas, 30x25 in., painted in 1795. Samuel Rose of Chancery Lane was a barrister and a literary man. "It was he who took Lawrence to Weston Underwood to meet the poet Cowper in 1793 ..." His daughter married Dr. Charles Burney. [See this source for more.]

### Bennett B. Rose of Alabama and Tennessee

[Editor's musings] This Rose is somewhat of an enigma. It would seem he should be a son of Bennett and Nancy (Burney) Rose of Lauderdale and Limestone Counties, Alabama. However, there is an unindentified James Rose or Ross who has not been identified who had a son Bennet Rose aged 13 in 1850.

Bennett B. Rose who died in the Civil War:

The above is not listed in either the 1850 census of Bennet and Nancy Rose, or in Nancy's 1860 census after her husband died. I believe he is the Benet [Bennet] Rose listed as ROSS in the 1850 census of Lauderdale Co., Alabama as follows.

Editor's note: I believe the above Samuel B. Rose is probably the Samuel Rose shown as aged 10 in the 1850 census of James Ross (sic? Rose) of Lauderdale Co., Ala. Also, it appears possible that Benet with James Ross is actually Bennet B. Rose who died in the Civil War, having served from Alabama, and that therefore Bennet B. Rose was a brother of Samuel B. Rose. This is however unproven and is supposition at this point.

## Birdie Cleveland (Rose) McDaniel of Christian County, Missouri

Steven provided this for our once proposed Heritage Rose project in the 1980s. This family descends from William Rose of Platte County, Missouri, an early Rose from Virginia who was a Revolutionary soldier.



The photograph is the wedding photo of Elmer Ross and Birdie Cleveland (Rose) McDaniel, taken on the 28th day of August, 1909, Nixa, Christian County, Missouri.

Elmer Ross McDaniel was born on the 27th day of January, 1889, Ozark, Christian County, Missouri and died on the 5th day of February, 1957, Springfield, Greene County, Missouri. He is buried at the family plot at Payne Cemetery, Christian County, Missouri. Mr. McDaniel was a tile-setter by trade and enjoyed farming, and the raising and canning of fruits and vegetables. He was the son of James Marion (1853-1913), and Mary Ellen (Bryant) 1855-1938) McDaniel, grandson of Alfred (1828-1861) and Ann Catherine (Vaughan) (1833-1923) McDaniel, great-grandson of Samuel (1796-1876) and Sarah (Bray) (1794 865) McDaniel, and great-great-grandson of Asa (1776-1854) and Sarah (McCullom) (1785-1875) McDaniel.

Birdie Cleveland (Rose) McDaniel was born on the 2nd of May 1890, Nixa, Christian County, Missouri, and died on the 21st day of November, 1953, Springfield, Greene County, Missouri. She is buried, next to her

husband, Elmer, at the family plot at Payne Cemetery, Christian County, Missouri. Birdie was a housewife and farmer and was known for her canning of fruits and vegetables, and her pies and cakes. She was a member of the Grant Avenue Baptist Church in Springfield, Green County, Missouri. Birdie Cleveland (Rose) McDaniel was the daughter of William Perry (1852-1908) and Ella Emma (Norton) (1869-1930) Rose, grand-daughter of Emsley (1815-1902) and Elizabeth (Price) (1819-1908) Rose, great-grand-daughter of Jeremiah (1786-1862) and Mary (Cameron) (1791-1855) Rose, and great-grand-daughter of the Revolutionary Soldier, William (1752-1839) and Mary (Riley?) (1760-1845) Rose.

## Lee Finley Green and wife Margaret Jane Rose

DESCENDANT OF GREEN LEE ROSE OF SOUTH CAROLINA AND TENNESSEE

Harry Green of Cincinnati, Ohio sometime ago put together a very nice manuscript of his Rose family with some photos of this interesting family. Green Lee W. Rose's death is unknown but he was living in 1850. He married, probably more than once. One wife, probably his first, was Lydia Black (see d.c. of daughter Elizabeth (Elisebeth). Lydia probably died between 1841 (birth of Elizabeth) and 1846 (birth of son James

Lee Finley Green was born 17 April 1869 in Bell County, Kentucky and died 6 January 1951 in Cincinnati, Ohio. He married Margaret Jane Rose on 12 September 1898 in Whitley County, Kentucky, daughter of James and L. Catharine () Rose. She was born in 1876 and died 5 January 1932 in Cincinnati, Ohio.

whose d.c. shows mother Charity Taylor). Green Rose married, 2nd?, Charity Taylor, her maiden name confirmed by the death certificate of son James Rose. After his death Charity married again, 4 April 1855, Harlan County, Kentucky VR, Amon Brock. (Data of Felicia Wylie states that Amon was born ca 1788 in S.C., d. 1863 in Pulaski Co., Ky.)

DNA testing of a descendant of Green Rose in 2003 had seemed at first to indicate that there is a relationship between Green Rose of South Carolina and Tennessee, and a descendant of Tormut Rose of Block Island, Rhode Island. Tormut Rose was in the colony by the mid-1600s. Later refinements of testing seem to discount that or at least suggest that if there was a connection, it was very distant. See Group M and M-1 of the Rose DNA project.

DNA testing also indicates a relationship between Green Rose, and George Rose (b. ca 1790, South Carolina) who appears in the 1850 census of Polk County, Tennessee. There is another Green Rose aged 19 listed in the 1860 census of Polk County, Tennessee who is probably a grandson of this George Rose, indicating the name of "Green" Rose is another clue to a relationship between these families.

Green Rose evidently lived for a time in Hawkins County, Hancock County and Polk County, Tennessee. In the pension record of his son James C. Rose, James' birthplace is listed as Hawkins County when he enlisted. In a letter in the file he states that after he came back from the war, his mother told him he was born in Polk County, Tennessee. The death record of George Rose, another son of Green Rose, states that George was born in Hancock County, Tennessee.

The father of Margaret Jane (Rose) Finley was James<sup>2</sup> Rose, the son of Green L. W. Rose. James' and his family lived in Whitley County, Kentucky. He married Catherine Romines, born 15 June 1848, died 9 August 1935 aged 87y 1m 14d (d.c.),

daughter of Ezekiel and Emma (Canatser?) Romines (and both were buried at Youngs Creek according to their death certificates which appear in his Civil War pension file. (The maiden name of Catherine Romines' mother appears to be Coraller? or similar in death certificate in the pension file, but descendant Larry G. Johnson states it is Canatser.)

The Civil War pension file of James Rose is referenced at the National Archives as:

JAMES ROSE. Co. B 47 Ky. Mtd. Inf. Invalid filed 1885, application 547297, certificate 443485. Remarks: CZ573137.

We published a summary of this pension file in a 1992 issue of the *Rose Family Bulletin*. Anyone who has an interest in this family will want to order the complete file from the National Archives (use NARA Form 85) as it is rich in many family details. If you obtained a copy of the file years ago from the Archives you probably only got 10-15 pages of the file while the complete file is very large with important family data you'll want to have!

Services assisted by the Newark Chapel of Henderson-Van-Stickle. [Condensed from a lengthy obituary sent by Betty Rose, name and date of newspaper not shown.

Betty adds from her research that Fred Rose's grandfather was Alvah Rose b. 15 May 1859 in Perry Co., Ohio, d. 16 May 1942, Hocking Co., Ohio, and married Ida Rodman. Alvah is known to be John<sup>3</sup>Rose(Rev. William<sup>2</sup>, Ezekiel<sup>1</sup> of Muskingham Co., Ohio and Washington Co., Pennsylvania. This is Group K of the YDNA project.

Member Betty Rose of Newark, Ohio, who sent the above, draws our attention to a lengthy obituary of Forest Rose, 64, "one of Johnstown's oldest families" who died in November 1937. He was the brother of Percy Allen Rose, attorney. He was son of W. Horace Rose whose Confederate war history is also related in the obituary. This family descended from William Rose of Bedford County, Pennsylvania, through Allen² Rose, Group BB of the YDNA project..


