*We do hope you are all enjoying your research, and have plans to attend family reunions this summer. There isn't one for your group? Think about organizing one!*



The following are condensed. They are obituaries of Roses aged 70 or older.



### Estate of Peter Rose

John Rose, executor, File #919. Appt. May 8, 1833, Appt. Journal E p. 451; Will Bk E p. 439. [See also 1st Acct Bk F p. 373]

Will Book E p. 439, will of Peter Rose, executor to pay \$100 to heirs of Caleb Thompson or the value in land; executor to pay son William Rose \$300 or the value in land. All estate real or personal to be equally divided between four children, John Rose, Peter Rose, George Rose and Reuben Rose, if any of devisees should die, their heirs to take their place, that is, heirs of John to take John's part, and so on, and "Ane" (?) Rose who is heir of Reuben Rose decd shall be entitled to Reuben's share. Appoints sons John Rose and Peter Rose executors. Dated: 6 Apr. 1832. Signed: Peter Rose. Wit.: John Thompson, Geo. M. Thompson. Proved: 5 Nov. 1832.

*Note:* In Deed Book O p. 476, there is a mortgage 17 Sept. 1831, John Mayhew and Sally his wife of Ohio Co., Va. to Peter Rose Sen. of co. and commonwealth aforesaid, for \$400, part of Hayes Addn. to Town of St. Clairsville, 2 lots, No. 10 and 11. It was witnessed by Danl Peck and Jno. Scatterdy. Acknowledged 17 Sept. 1831, recorded 19 Sept. 1831. In a deed (Book P p. 338, Belmont., Ohio), an instrument of Peter Rose to George Rose is mentioned, implying a relationship between the two.

Linwood H. Rose announced that he will retire as president of James Madison University in Harrisonburg in June 2012. James E. Hart,



## JARED ROSE

OLD WAR PENSION FILE

*This was abstracted by editor from the original Old War Pension Files, National Archives, indexed on microfilm publication T316. What is known as "Old War" pensions are pensions for the regular Army, and for those who died in wars before pension acts were passed for those wars.*

Citation: JARED ROSE. Delia, widow. Priv., 4 U.S. Art., Mex. War. Wid., Certificate 990, filed 5712, N.Y.

Affidavit: Jefferson Co., N.Y., 31 Aug 1848, Delia Rose, resident of town of Rutland, Co. of Jefferson, N.Y., age 35, under act of July 15, 1848, is widow of Jared Rose, Priv., was in War with Mexico, enlisted Oswego, N.Y. Dec. 25, 1847, enlisted by Serg. Barous, attached to 4th Reg. U.S. Art., became sick, to New Orleans where he died in the Mil. Barracks 23 May 1848, married at Malone, Co. of Franklin [no state given] 20 Sept. 1832, she has one child born 3 Apr. 1835, Helen M. Rose, minor under 16, she not married. Signed: Delia Rose.

Affidavit: William J. Sykes, Jefferson Co., N.Y.

Affidavit: Jefferson Co., N.Y., 14 July 1853, Delia Rose, resident of Rutland in said county, under act of 3 Feb. 1853, etc. Signs name.

**ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:** Editors located this at the Jefferson Co., New York Courthouse. Minute Bk B p 575: 4 Aug. 1852, petition of Delia Rose grdn of Helen M. Rose, minor, both lately of Rutland, mentions Warrant 66677 bounty land, 160 acres in name of Delia Rose widow and Helen M. Rose, child and heir at law of Jared Rose decd, a Priv. 4 Reg. U.S. Art., under date Dec. 17, 1849, exec. at Pension office. 4 Aug. 1852. Rec.: same

March 3, 1857. CHAP. CLXXXVIII.—*An Act for the Relief of John B. Rose, of Wabash County, Indiana.*

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Secretary of the Interior be and he is hereby directed to cause to be issued to John B. Rose, of Wabash county Indiana, a warrant for one hundred and sixty acres of land, in consideration of his services as lieutenant of the fifteenth regiment of United States infantry during the last war with Great Britain.*

Hannah Rose of twp. of Blockley, county of Philadelphia, widow, with Joseph Rose and William Rose of said twp., cutlers, John Frailey of twp., wheelwright, and William Warner of same twp., farmer, bondsmen for administrators Hannah Rose and Joseph Rose and William Rose as administrators of estate of WILLIAM ROSE dec'd, cutler. Signed: Hannah Rose, Joseph Rose, William Rose. Appeared 14 Apr. 1810: Hannah Rose, Joseph Rose.

INVENTORY: Filed May 1810.

### Estate of THOMAS ROSE.

#### File 25 Bk P p 191, 1842.

[Iris Rowe found this in Williams, *Index of Wills and Adm. Phila. Pa. 1832-50, publ. 1971/2*]

Estate of THOMAS ROSE, brick-maker, Phila., who d. 19 Jan. 1842, intestate. His widow Nancy (usually referred to as Ann) and his son Thomas J. Rose adm. (Thomas J. Rose, Mtg. Co. Pa.). Bond: Michael McGill and James McCormick, Southwark. INVENTORY includes furnishings for 3-story house, also sheds and other buildings of tools etc. and thousands of bricks. List of money on hand, plus estate expenditures also given. Among the money distributions appeared the names of Edmund, Martha, David, Thomas, Charles, John and Ann, with amounts to each.

[Evidently from loose papers?]

INVENTORY: Filed Feb 7, 1842 [jacket]

BOND: Ann Rose of N Liberties Widow, Thomas J Rose of Montgomery [does not say county] Michael McGill of N. Liberties and James McCormick of Southwark, securites for Ann Rose and Thomas J. Rose as adm. of Thomas Rose "B" decd. Signed: Ann Rose, Thomas J. Rose, Michael McGill, James McCormick. Dated 19 Jan. 1842 at which time they appeared, "they are Widow & Son of said deceased."

ACCOUNT: Includes large list of debts due, including an item to "F. Brown (Laurel Hill Cemetery) and including amounts due to

Edmond Rose \$26.88; Martha Rose 1239.72; Ann Rose 227.37; Chas Rose 298.83, John Rose 171.45, David Rose 2159.56 and at the end of the list Thomas Rose 447.12.

INVENTORY: appraised 5 Feb. 1842 \$264.--? Appraisers William Thomas; Isaac Bellangee.

### Will Book 85, p. 387. Will of SARAH E. ROSE.

Will of SARAH ROSE, gives house and lot at No. 2227 Spring Garden St., City of Philadelphia, to my son Wilbur F. Rose, and appoints him executor. Dated 29 Jan. 1872. Signed: Sarah E. Rose. Wit.: Melvina E. Slaght, J. E. Stiles, James W. Slaght. Proved: Oct. 6, 1875, W. F. Rose, Camden, N.J. Sworn: Sept. 28, 1875.

### Original File #165, Estate of STEPHEN ROSE.

Mary Rose, administratrix of estate of Stephen Rose, administration granted 16 Oct. 1810, entered in Book K folio 398 (though this is the original document in the original file). Signed: Mary (her x mark) Rose. She of District of Southwark. Stephen Rose shown as Mariner.



## Elijah Rose family of New York and Indiana

*Sent by member Anne Cady 2439C98 who believes this to Elisha and Milly (Hawes) Rose based on a comparison of a photo that was in the possession of Charles Leap (long-time member now deceased). (For more on this family of Elisha see Family Report of the Rose Family Association on Elisha Rose listed at [www.RoseFamilyAssociation.com](http://www.RoseFamilyAssociation.com). DNA testing puts these Roses in Group T of the Rose DNA project, with the ROOSA family.)*

Elisha Rose married 1st, data unknown but probably in New York. His first wife probably died between 1820 and 1823, based on his listing in the 1820 census of Washington County, Indiana. It is believed that she may be Olive McClellan. We are told that an old diary in Tompkins County, New York mentions Esquire Treat (or is his diary) of Mendon, Monroe County, and evidently in this diary it mentions Olive Rose who died in Indiana. The notes in the diary are said to be ca 1840.

He married 2nd, 12 September 1823, Clark County, Indiana (NARA land bounty file) to Milla Haws who was born ca 1800-1801 (aged 68 in 1868 affidavit, land bounty file; aged 49 in 1850 census). Her death unknown.

In a paper found involving the estate of Sarah Park, Ontario County, New York, prepared in 1823 by the children of her deceased daughter Olive Park McClallen, is some valuable information. The original of this draft is in the "McClellan Family Papers" in the Utica, Michigan Public Library. Condensed from this document:

Christopher Park of Bloomfield, county of Ontario decd, by his will devised all real and personal to his widow Sarah Park as long as she remained unmarried, and whereas said Christopher Park died seized of real estate during the life of his widow it was sold and conveyances thereof duly executed as will [?] by the said widow as the children of the said Christopher Park, to wit: Olive Park, Mary Williams, and Wealtha Barrett. 

These Roses are part of Group D of the Rose Y-DNA project which has ties to the Palatine-Germany-Holland Roses.

Tim has copies from the Civil War pension file which proves that Jefferson survived the Civil War and did not die then as some family records show. Jefferson made an affidavit in 1907 from Delta County, Colorado, aged 74, and states he was born in Bucks County, Pennsylvania, on May 16, 1832. His death certificate, LaPlata County, shows that Jefferson Jackson Madison Rose was male, white, married, born May 16, 1832, died aged 80y 5m 15d on October 28, 1912, was a retired carpenter, born Pennsylvania, son of Chapman Rose born Scotland [a known error], mother was Annie Collins was born Wales, and that the informant was Frank Rose of Durango, Colorado. Undertaker was Goodman & Delany.

## “A Rose by Any Other Name ...”

*[Editor's note: Joe is a descendant of Samuel<sup>1</sup> and Lydia (Sizemore) Rose of Wilkes County, North Carolina through their son Isaiah<sup>2</sup> Rose (m. Mary Baugus), their son Bryant<sup>3</sup> Rose (m. Rosamond Wyatt), and their son Barton<sup>4</sup> Rose, father of Barton Thompson. This family is part of Group M1 of the Association's Y-DNA project.]*

Our family's biannual 10-hour trips from western Pennsylvania to my mother's home in Mercer County, West Virginia were no less than grueling, especially for two kids prone to car-sickness once we crossed the state line onto those winding, stomach-turning roads. The long day did culminate finally with our arrival at the home of our grandparents, Bart and Arta Thompson. Their home, perched on a steep hillside, was another world to us Yankee children. My grandmother would either be sitting on the porch, her long hair draped over the railing, slowly drying from a recent washing, or she would be in the chicken yard eyeing up the latest candidate for dinner that evening. Granddad, in his flannel shirt and suspenders (always there for snapping) had our coffee ready, special cups for my sister and I that consisted basically of Kayro Syrup and heavy cream.

The conversations my grandfather and I had inevitably came around to the subject of my middle name, a name he would pretend to have somehow forgotten. My proclamations of “It's Bart!” never failed to produce gales of laughter and a glow on his face that I can still see. Mornings were especially exciting: My sister and I would huddle in our sleeping bags on the floor while Granddad banged and rattled the coal stove, bringing it to life with an intense and welcome red heat. Waiting for the house to warm, we would often look up at the two elaborately framed pictures staring down at us, quieted by their stern expressions. One was of my grandmother's parents, looking particularly glum. The other was the lone portrait of Cassie Thompson, Bart's mother. We knew from stories that Cassie was a deaf

mute, never married, yet the mother of Bart and his older half-brother, Cyrus. I have no recollection of specific conversations regarding who Bart's father might be, but the name Rose was interjected somewhere along the way and that bit of information stayed with me.

Decades later, after grandparents as well as parents had passed away, life's events brought about a reunion with one of my maternal cousins, Brenda. We are eight years apart in age so while our childhoods barely overlapped, we were nonetheless totally thrilled at becoming reacquainted and catching up on near and distant family matters. At some point I brought up the subject of Cassie and questioned Brenda whether she was aware of the name Rose and its possible connection to our grandfather's father. To my surprise, she informed me that she had always heard that Mr. Rose's first name was also Bart! This was incredible to me, given that Cassie could neither hear nor speak, yet her family thought it fitting to name this illegitimate child after his own father, without the benefit of marriage.

My interest peaked, I began to notice web sites such as Ancestry.com, and a full subscription was soon acquired. I have no idea what the statistics are concerning a person's first exposure to a powerful narcotic as it relates to that person becoming seriously hooked, but I can attest to the fact that those first successful “hits” in genealogy are an inevitable frontrunner to an inescapable passion! In short order, via census records, I found a Barton Rose, also in *[con't next page]*

[con't] Mercer County, West Virginia. The name Barton puzzled me however until I came to the 1900 census and the household in which Cassie was living. Listed as head of household was Cassie's widowed sister, Almedia Bastrum. Below that were Almedia's children, then Cassie [listed as Junta C. Thompson], and then 20-year old Cyrus, and 13-year-old, "Barton" listed as nephews of Almedia. With no birth record having been recorded, this is the earliest documentation so far found for him. My grandfather, always known as Bart, was actually named Barton.

Fellow genealogists will understand when I say the heavens literally opened up. Perhaps this is part of the wonder of genealogy: Bringing to light facts that illuminate a family and its members. As a good fortune would have it, my quest also brought me in touch with a fellow genealogist and distant cousin, Mary Ellen Howe (a direct descendant of Cassie's sister, Mary Jane). Mary Ellen's area of expertise was the Bailey family, the maternal line behind Cassie and her sisters. Not only had Mary Ellen published two previous books on the Bailey family\*, but a third one was ready to go to press and contained the story of Cassie and her sons. Cassie's first son had been fathered by her sister Almedia's husband, a man who not long after was killed by a falling tree, leaving Almedia a widow. Almedia married again a few years later and moved away to Kentucky with her new husband. We are not sure where Cassie was living at the time she gave birth to Bart, but by 1900 Almedia, widowed again, moved back to Mercer County and Cassie and her sons were once again living with her. Mary Ellen assured me that various other sources (all verbal) linked Barton Rose to Bart so I went ahead and added Barton Rose to my family tree, along with his lineage that traces back to Samuel and Lydia (Sizemore) Rose of Wilkes County, North Carolina. Even with all this "proof", there still remained a bit of a shadow over all of this information. My strongest "documentation" was hearsay, and while more or less acceptable, was not quite enough to satisfy me.

Thanks to the internet and its miraculous search engines, it was at this point that I became acquainted with the Rose Family Association website. To say I was overwhelmed at first glance is an understatement. The whole endeavor was as massive as it was incredible. Reading down the long list of family reports I was no less than thrilled to come across one for Samuel and Lydia Rose and immediately ordered the report. To say this report was all encompassing

is an understatement. What I received was 20 pages of detailed and documented information on Barton Rose's ancestors. My genealogical cup runneth over!

However, the caveat remained, were these people truly, without a doubt, part of my family tree? It was probably not until my third or fourth visit to the Rose Family Association web page that I noticed the DNA bar at the top left of the page. Through this link I became acquainted with Family Tree DNA and the Rose Family DNA Project. Without waxing poetic, I must again interject a bit of genealogy truth: The path of genealogy is in many ways a treasure hunt. It was at this point that I came in contact with David Brown and Marcia Brown. I e-mailed them both with Cassie's story and my question as to the possibility of finally confirming the paternity of my grandfather. David replied with "This is a story waiting to be told." Marcia at that point patiently picked up the reins and explained the whole DNA process to me. She informed me that they did have DNA on this line, specifically DNA coming down from Barton Rose's younger brother, James. She also explained the importance of testing a male-line relative as it is Y-DNA that is only passed from father to son. Since it was through my mother that would be related to Barton Rose, I was eliminated as a good candidate. My mother had five brothers however and fortunately it was not long before I had a male-line descendant cousin who agreed to take the DNA test. Myself and my cousins were quite excited and could only marvel at the amount of information about to come off the tip of a little swab of cotton. [con't next page]

I must leave it to the reader's imagination as to the excitement that I and my family felt over Marcia Brown's e-mail confirming that the markers had come in matching "PERFECTLY" with those of the M1 line of the Rose Family Association. My grandfather Bart Thompson, born 125 years ago, finally had his parentage confirmed. It was no longer just a rumor or oft-stated story, it had become fact. The information from the DNA test reached Mary Ellen Howe's Volume III just as it went to press, a blurb about the verifying results barely making it in.

Only a few of the details regarding the relationship between Barton and Cassie are known. Cassie could communicate some with gestures and motions, and according to many sources had shown my grandmother where she and Barton would meet for their rendezvous. Barton was married with a family of his own, and later in life went on to become a preacher. Cassie, known for her fastidiousness and "eagle eye," lived the remainder of her life with one or the other of her sons. Bart and Cyrus lived about five miles apart and Cassie would every so often pack her belongings into a little suitcase, stack her four or five hats on top of her head, and make the trek alone from one son's home to the other. Cassie died in 1932 at the age of 76. The only other photo of her that exists was taken late in her life, showing a petite, smiling woman with a pot of flowers in her arms. I cannot help but imagine how much broader that smile would be if she could have witnessed what was finally accomplished via the Rose Family Association and the Rose Family DNA Project.

[This was also published in Christine Rose's *The Brothers Rev. Robert Rose and Rev. Charles Rose of Morayshire, Scotland and Colonial Virginia*, 1985.]

Member Thomas M. Rose #1181R93 of Richmond, Virginia, tells us that he had exciting news in identifying his great grandfather's parents, Bernard Rose and Anna Margareth Goette. They had been stymied for years for the latter names, overseas location and other information. Recently his great grandfather's (Johann/John Joseph Rose) tombstone was damaged at the Riverview Cemetery in Richmond, Virginia, apparently by the grounds staff cutting grass. In verifying dates for him before installing a new tombstone Thomas' sister Bonnie found correct dates for him as born 1823. Later he somehow became seven years younger!
