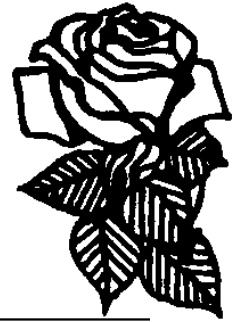

Rose (1860-1935) and Flavia Buck Rose (1859-1954), and the grandson of Reuben Palmer Rose (1838-1923) and Mary Stanton Rose (1840-1929).]

Member Norm Freyer #27229F01 tells us: "After my mother, Doris Rose Hodkinson 1913-2011 (Doris Rose Freyer) died in 2011, while sorting through her files, we found the attached photo of the Reuben P. Rose family taken in 1917. We had never seen this photo before and were thrilled because we had not seen a photo of most of the family together at one time. My mother is the little girl to the right in the photo.

"We can only speculate that the photo was taken on the occasion of Francis Howard Rose being home on furlough as a Baptist missionary to the Philippine Islands. Dr. Rose and his wife, Gertrude Coombs Rose, spent much of their lives as missionaries to the Philippines. The Roses and nine other missionaries were beheaded by Japanese soldiers during World War II on the island of Panay on either December 20 or 21, 1943."

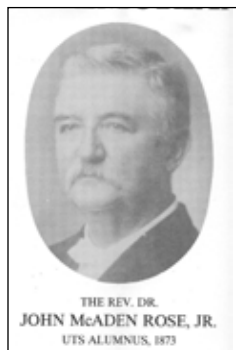

The Rev. Dr. John McAden Rose, Jr.

UTS ALUMNUS, 1873

Dr. Ben Lacy Rose, descendant of Alexander Rose of Person County, North Carolina, sent before his decease a large poster "In Memoriam" of The Rev. Dr. John McAden Rose, Jr. "The Seminary Relations Center of Union Theological Seminary in Virginia was established in 1988 in memory of The Rev. Dr. John McAden Rose, Jr., and was made possible by a bequest from his son, William Cumming Rose, Ph.D.

The poster further shows that John McAden Rose, Jr. was born in



Fayetteville, North Carolina. His education was at Donaldson Academy, Fayetteville, NC, Davidson College 1864-65, University of North Carolina 1867,

Union Theological Seminary in Virginia, graduated 1873, and Davidson College, Doctor of Divinity 1895. He was licensed in Fayetteville Presbytery in 1872. His pastorates and other services were also included.

Following the above, on the poster, was information on his son William Cumming Rose (see *Rose Family Bulletin* September 2013 p. 5483). William was born 4 April 1887 in Greenville, South Carolina and received his education at Davidson College, BS in 1907, and Yale University, Ph.D. in Biochemistry in 1911.

REV. ROBERT ROSE FAMILY

The following, abstracted by editors at the courthouse, involve the family of the well-known Rev. Robert Rose of Scotland and early Virginia. Note: Fredericksburg is one of many independent cities in Virginia. It is not part of the adjoining counties; it has its own courthouse.

CHANCERY COURT 1815-1820

Rose, Judgment by Court on p. 220, Mary Rose \$226.83 and part of property to her.

Abstracted at the courthouse by editor. Early estates; may not be complete.

Vol. 2 p. 92, Inventory of estate of Jabiz? Rose taken 1 Nov. 1707, Feb. 12, 1707 Mary Rose widow of Jaboz? of Scituate made oath of inventory of her late husband. Wit.: Josiah Torroy, Stephen Clay.

Vol. 2 p. 122, Elizabeth Rose widow of Jeromiah Rose, 23 Mar. 1709/10, Inventory of Jeremiah Rose late of Scituate decd taken 21 Mar. 1709. Total 208.13. Elizabeth Rose made oath.

Vol. 5 p. 68, Settlement of estate of Jeremiah Rose late of Scituate, Plymouth Co., viz, real estate of the Jeremiah Rose being formerly settled and divided, freeholders directs accounting to sum of 240 pounds hereby settled and ordered to Elisabeth Symmes now the wife of Timothy Symmes of Scittuate formerly the widow of the Jeremiah Rose the 3rd part of the profitts & Incomes of all Housing & land & Real Estate afore during her Natural life which Timothy & Elisabeth Symmes agree to accept, take as satisfied in full of her 3rd part as widows thirds divided in four parts & among the 3 children of the decd to wit Gideon Rose, Thomas Rose and Elizabeth Rose. [date?]

MEXICAN WAR PENSION FILE

Abstracted at the National Archives by editor. Record Group 15. The Mexican pension files have not been microfilmed but can be ordered on NATF 85 from the National Archives. See their website at www.archives.gov. These can be ordered online, or by using the form and mailing it to the National Archives.

GEORGE ROSE, widow George Ann Rose, Co. F 16 U. S. Inf., Mex. Sur. Appl. 11145, cert. 8114, widow filed May 24, 1895, widow Appl. 12755, act of 1/29/1887, Ky. Remarks: Trans. to Army 617,069. See. WC #436205. [File citation]

Affidavit: Mercer Co., Ky., Pension Claim, affidavit of William H. Handell who says that he is 50, was present at the marriage of George Ann Ransdall and Mr. George Rose, married at her father's house in Mercer Co., Ky. on or about Feb. 21, 186-?.

Affidavit: Mercer Co., Ky. 16 May 1896, George Ann Rose, widow of George Rose, states he died 29 Apr. 1894, married 21 Feb. 1860 at or near Bohon, Ky., that her name was George Ann Ransdall, her residence is county of Washington, Ky. and her po is Dargansville, Mercer Co., Ky. Wit.: William D. Sharp, William H. Long, 16 Apr. 1896 [note difference in dates].

Affidavit: Mercer Co., Ky. 7 Mar. 1887, George Rose, resident of Sharpsville, Washington Co., Ky., Priv., E. H. Grans?, 16th Reg. Ky. Vols., Col. John Tabatts, enlisted at Oregon, Ky. 25 Apr. 1847, is aged 59, born near Harrodsburg 15 Dec. 1827, disabled by rheumatism, now married, wife was Nancy Ann Vandiver?, married Harrodsburg [nothing more added about her], present wife Geo. Ann (Ronsdell) Rose. Signed by x mark.

Affidavit: Mercer Co., Ky. of W. H. Vandivier, states that first wife of George Rose was Nancy Ann Rose who died in Mercer Co. Ky. in 1857, she buried at Beriah?, was present at her burial. Dated 18 May 1896.

GEORGE W. ROSE. Cherry's Co. Lauderdale Batt'n., Tenn. Mtd. Inf., Cherokee War. Priv./Priv. Notation: Mustered in May 8, 1838. A muster-in roll dated Ross Landing, Tenn. Oct. 31, 1837, joined that date. A muster-out roll dated Baton Rouge, La. May 8, 1838.

GREEN G. L. W. ROSE. Scrogg's Co. 3 Tenn. Mtd. Mil., Cherokee War. Priv./Priv. Co. muster roll dated July 8, 1836 enr. July 1, 1836, Greene Co., travel 130 m. to place of rendezvous and 130 m. from place of discharge to home.

HOWELL H. ROSE, H. H. ROSE. Fry's Co. Ala. Mtd. Vols. (Creek War), Priv./Priv. Co. muster-out roll dated Claysville, Ala. Nov. 18, 1836, enr. Sept. 5, 1836 at Barter's? Store. Also company muster-in roll.

JAMES ROSE. Co. G Snodgrass No. Ala. Mtd. Vols., Fla. War, Priv./Priv. A muster-out roll, enrolled Oct. 26, 1837 at Bellefonte, Ala., absent without leave Apr. 5. Shows Co. G (Boullon's).

Rose Reflections [Emanuel Rose]

[Charter member Orella Chadwick # 0302C81 of Tillamook, Oregon, is sharing the status of her research on her ancestor Emanuel Rose of Surry and Wilkes Counties, North Carolina. There are no known male descendants in an uninterrupted Rose line so Orella is hoping that by sharing her records someone might be able to help.] Says Orella:

One would think with a name like Emanuel (Amanuel, Imanuel, Manuesl) that the records would be too elusive but even though I have been searching since the 1960s, I have no clue as to his parents, his siblings, nor where they came from before Surry/Wilkes Counties, North Carolina. Is he on a Passenger List and I have missed it, or was he born in America? I hope someone out there can give me all the information I lack!

Emanuel Rose had a wife named Mary. Family tradition is that she was a Hampton but this has not been verified. Later Mary's daughter Mary (Rose) Holloway named a son Hampton which could help give some validity to the possibility that Mary was indeed a Hampton.

On 29 June 1778 Emanuel Rose was granted Land Entry #223 for 100 or 450 acres including improvements on Roaring River, where he then lived. On 5 September 1778 (Entry Book 1778-81) he is listed with entry #313, 450 acres on Middle Fork of Roaring River adjoining Widow Alexander in Benjamin Cleveland's District. However, his name was marked out and the name of John Allen Woodruff written over (who is another ancestor of mine). But another source says it was 200 acres ... take your pick! In 1779 he received another grant for 70 acres on Roaring River. On 25 March 1780. He received Grant #1687 or #152 which appears to be for 440 acres on middle fork of Roaring River.

In 1782 Emanuel Rose was taxed and paid in Wilkes County on 170 acres, 4 horses and 6 cattle, and 1 slave. In 1784 he was taxed on 424 acres and had 1 poll (himself). In 1785 in Capt. Samuel Johnson's District, 2 polls. This is also the year that the law was enacted that excused those who had reached age 60 years from taxes. The same listing appeared in 1787 and that year he was on a Road Jury from Iron Works to N. Fork of Roarin' River to S. Fork. In 1787 he was on the Tax List for 135 acres and 2 pol taxes, 1 black aged 21-50.

In the Wilkes County Court Minutes by Ruby Absher (covering 1778-1788) besides relating the above mentioned land grants and jury duty, it shows that in 1787 Amanuel Rose was on the jury for trials in July 1788 of Jms. Reynolds vs John Hall Sr. and Edmund Denny; also Reubin White vs Wm. McGill; Thos. Calloway vs. Thos. Terry; Daniel Hull vs Jn. Turnbull, five of seven trials listed with Emanuel as a jurymen.

In 1788 he was taxed on 2 polls on 75 acres (another source says 135 acres) but he also received another 60 acre grant that might be the explanation for the total of 135 acres. He is also on land sales to Edmond Booz and James Webb. In 1789 he is listed with 2 polls on 195 acres. It is a puzzle as to why he was still paying a poll tax; if it was for Emanuel he had reached age 60 and should no longer be paying a poll on himself. Or, did he have a slave or other adult living with him and working on the farm, on which tax was due? In 1792 he is listed with 1 poll on 335 acres; same in 1793-4-5. Then Emanuel is gone from the lists and Mary Hampton Rose in 1796 paid 1 poll and is listed with 250 acres; in 1797 she is listed with 350 acres and no polls.

The only census I have for Emanuel Rose is in Capt. Johnson's District taken 7 July 1787; 1 Wm. 21-60.

Could this poll by Joseph Rose/Ross who is named in the following:

Deed Bk D p. 352, 7 Oct. 1797, Mary Rose of Wilkes Co. to John Brown of same, [torn] mentions land sold to Emanuel Rose on Roaring River [which is evidently the land being now sold, or at least part of it.] Signed: Mary (her x mark) Rose. Wit.: William Allison, John Holloway, Joseph Rose. Ack.: [torn] Term 1798, proved by oath of William Allison. [Mentions will of Emanuel Rose.]

I have never found this Joseph in the records before or since that record. If Emanuel had been married before and had a son Joseph by that previous marriage, that son would seem to have been considerably older than Emanuel's wife Mary.

Proof of the re-marriage of the widow Mary Rose: 6 Feb. 1799, Mary Rose, now Mary Hall, relinquished right to administer estate of Emanuel Rose dec'd, Spencer Adams appointed administration (Wilkes Co. Court of Pleas and Quarter Session Minutes 1798-1821, as published in Wilkes County Genealogical Society Bulletin. It is known that her second husband was John Hall Sr.

The last will of Emanuel Rose, deceased, May Term 1796, is dated 3 May 1796. Mary Rose received letters of administration on Emanuel's estate on the oath of John Hammon. In August of 1796 Mary was taxed 1 poll on 250 acres.

The will of Emanuel Rose declares him to be of Wilkes County, North Carolina, "in perfect mind and memory but somewhat afflicted in body." His will was recorded in Wilkes County, North Carolina, Vol. II p. 482. An abstract:

May Term 1796. Will of Emanuel Rose of Wiles Co. N.C., to wife Mary Rose my "hole" estate during her life or widowhood and after her decease or marriage to be equally divided between my five children to wit Kezia Rose, Mary Holloway, Sary Rose, Elizabeth Rose, Susanna Rose. Before it is divided each one of them that is single at this time to have as much as Mary who is married, to wit, one good horse and saddle, one good bed and furniture, one cow?, one sow and piggs, one ewe and lamb, then balance to be equally divided between the whole five children. Dated 28 Aug. 1794. Signed: Emanuel (his x mark) Rose. Wit.: John Hamon, Wm. (his x mark) Drummon. [No executor named.]

The account of Emanuel's estate was filed July Term 1799. One horse, one cow and calf, Hoggs, one Loom, pewter, one pot, one book, one jug, one flesh fork, one saddle, one hacklet, one piggin, one churn, one wheel, hogsheads, one grind stone, one ax, one mattock, one plow, one watch, one bed. Inventory made by Spencer Adams, Administrator. Signed: Wm. Lenoir, C.C. (It would appear from the item of one bed that some of the estate had been distributed before the account was made.)

From this a question arises: Was John Hamon (the witness) related to Mary Hampton (which appears to be the previous name of Emanuel's wife)?

Other items of interest:

In February 1787 the Old Roaring River Primitive Baptist Church thought it proper to deny Emanuel Rose fellowship. (From Mrs. Ruby Absher's papers, no citation.)

On page 239 of *Some Pioneers of Wilkes Co., NC* by Mrs. W. O. Absher is mentioned the estate of Randolph Holbrook in 173. Purchasers included Richard Bauguess, Emanuel and Joseph Rose (no citation).

Some notes on the daughters of Emanuel Rose.

Mary, the daughter of Emanuel and Mary Rose, married John Holloway, son of Stephen Holloway. When Mary (Hampton?) Rose's second husband John Hall Sr. died ca 1815, John Holloway was Mary's surety.

Kezia, the daughter of Emanuel and Mary Rose, married Richard Boggess/Bauguess. I have considerable information on this side of the family.

Sarah, the daughter of Emanuel and Mary Rose, married a Serenger. Either he or she died of palsy at age 71 on 14 March 1855 in Smyth County, Virginia, from information provided by their daughter Mary Brown.

Elizabeth, the daughter of Emanuel and Mary Rose, married John Sparks and moved to Texas. No further information on this couple.

Bedford County, Pennsylvania Rose Family to Ohio

Member Cindy Newman #3304N12 is a descendant of this family and has collected some wonderful records. The following was abstracted by editors at the National Archives from the War of 1812 Pension File of this soldier but we had not yet published it. Then Cindy recently provided photocopies of the file which she obtained from the National Archives in D.C.

JOHN ROSE. Old Act. Navy #1025. (National Archives War of 1812 Pension)

Affidavit: Bedford Co., Pa., Nov 19, 1819, letter written on behalf of John Rose who died in his tour on Lake Erie under Commodore Perrys Fleet and left "A Disconsolate widow and three orphans one of which is a Daughter Not yet 14 years of age." Signed: Wm. Evans, who states that the widow lives in Bedford Co. near Shellsburgh.

Affidavit: Bedford Co. Pa., 16 Dec. 1824, John Kinton and Elizabeth Kinton his wife say that they saw John Rose and Martha Taylor married in twp. of Bedford in same county, reported that John Rose slain in Battle 10 Sept. 1813 in the ship Lawrence. Signed: John Kinton, Elizabeth (her x mark) Kinton. Wit.: Michael Rees?, Job Mann, Prothy.

Bedford Feb. 14, 1825, letter written at request of Mrs. Martha Rose, widow of John Rose killed on board the Lawrence, she is ill etc., encloses View of the Campaigns of the North Western Army, etc. where the name of John Rose the husband of Martha will be found on the list killed. Signed: D. R. Denny, Bedford, Pa.

Affidavit: Allegheny Co., Pa., 2 Feb. 1833, Mrs. Martha Rose, of the city of Pittsburgh and late of StaysTown in Somerset Co., Pa., widow of John Rose, etc. Signs name. Wit.: John Morrow and George Y. Glessener?

Affidavit: Hocking Co., Ohio, 23 Jan. 1836, Elias R. Stevens and Matilda B. Stevens, affidavit that Martha Rose who is applying under act of 30 June 1834 is widow of John Rose, Seaman killed at Lake Erie under O. H. Perry, she formerly resided in Pittsburgh, Pa. but now resident of Logan, Hocking Co., Ohio, she is still a widow. Signed: Elias R. Stevens, Matilda B. Stevens.

Affidavit: Bedford Co. Pa., 12 Apr. 1825, John Clark and Henry Dare? or Doer?, they know Martha Rose of Napier twp., county afsd, she remained a widow.

Letter, City Washington, 10 Feb. 1820, enclosed letter on behalf of widow of John Rose decd, I expect the widow "Marry or Martha Rose" claim is lost in the War Dept., she lived in Bedford Co. Pa., has three children, etc.

Form: John Rose Seaman in Navy, departed on board Lawrence, killed 10 Sept. 1813, married to said John Rose "she thinks I believe in April in the year 1795," claims pension under act 3 Mar. 1845. Signed: Martha (her x mark) Rose 13 Jan. 1846.

Form: 4 Apr. 1848, widow of John Rose [very light], her husband died, etc., she married him "March" in the year 1795. Signed: Martha (her x mark) Rose. James A.? Stretch? J.P. [Location not noted on above but Asberry Steele?, Clerk of the Circuit Court of Grant Co., Ind. states James A. Stretch is J.P., 14 Mar. 1848.]

Other miscellaneous papers in the file.

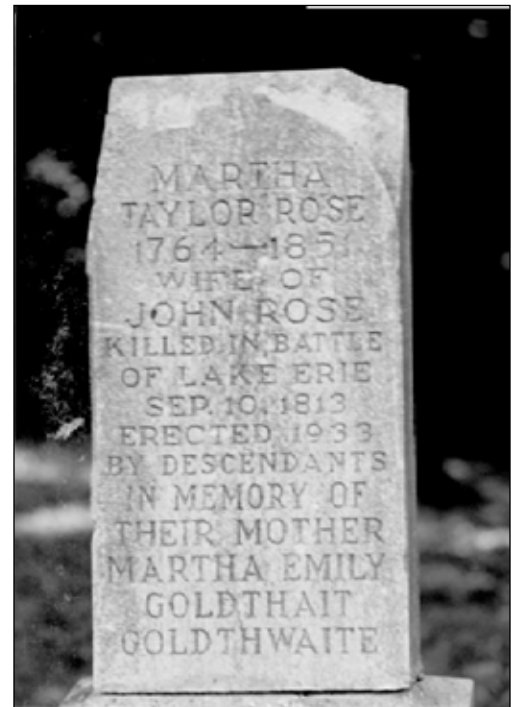

- i. daughter, she is probably Matilda who m. Elias Stevens (they made affidavit in the war file; also, Martha Rose age 86 was living with them in the 1850 census of Grant County, Indiana)
- ii. David (see guardianship record)
- iii. Allen (see guardianship record). Is he the Allen Rose in 1830 census of Allegheny County, Pennsylvania? Allen not there in 1840 and 1850 census.

Some Misplaced NARA Military files

MATTHIAS ROSE and MATTHEW ROSE

Bounty Land File; Act of 1850

In 1983 your editor, while researching in the National Archives, found an error in the filing of papers in the files of Matthew Rose and Matthias Rose. She wrote to William E. Lind, at that time in the Military Archives Division, to tell him that in abstracts she had made from the bounty land file there appeared to be a problem in that two papers which should have been in the Matthew Rose file 1850 Rej. 27322 (one being an affidavit 25 March 1851 from Hancock County, Illinois by the widow Emely Rose) were instead in the bounty land file of a Matthias Rose.

Under date of January 25, 1983, Mr. Lind did find that indeed the declaration which should have been in the Matthew Rose file was found in the Matthias Rose file. He reported: "The original is now in the file of Matthew Rose, BLWT 70866-160-35."

JOHN WESLEY ROSE Union Pension

Co. I 1 Ark. Cav. Minor filed 1893, #581640, Ill.

In 1990 editor again asked Mr. Lind's assistance for in a visit to the National Archives in 1990 she noted that there was a John Rose who served in Co. E 1 Ark. Cav who married Amanda Tidwell. He did not die in service as did the John Wesley Rose in whose file this paper appeared. The John that lived was John Rose, Co. K 1 Ark. Cav. Invalid filed 1863 #21565, cert. 103303.

Christine did not retain Mr. Lind's written reply, but anyone researching either of the above two John Rose should examine both files. It is likely it was corrected at the time.

(Editor Christine, in viewing some old files, found the above letters and wants to be sure the information is passed to descendants. Mr. Lind, who later retired, was always of assistance in matters that were presented to him.)

PLEASANT ROSE

The American State Papers, thirty-eight physical volumes, contain the legislative and executive documents of Congress during the period 1789 to 1838. The collection includes documents that cover the critical historical gap from 1789 to the printing of the first volume of the U.S. Serial Set in 1817. The books are arranged into ten topical classes or series.

From Vol. 1 p. 803, 1809, Land Claims in the Mississippi Territory, includes interesting information on Pleasant Rose who "was in the occupancy and possession of the land in question after the 3d of March, 1803, as well as before that time; that he verily believed that said Rose resided there on said 3d of March. See also the same volume, pp. 773 and 774, for two items involving Pleasant Rose dated 16 September 1802. "I, John Baker, do hereby oblige myself and heirs to pay unto Pleasant Rose for all the improvements he shall make upon a lot rented him, where he now lives, for two years ..." etc. This was signed by Jno. Baker.

Pleasant Rose signed a statement that he received in possession, for John Baker, a certain improvement made by John Berry, and sold by virtue of a writ of attachment by the sheriff of Washington county, to said Baker, etc.

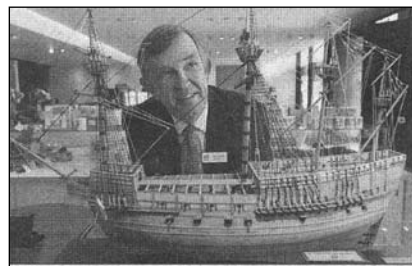

Daniel Rose of McLean County, Illinois

Summarized from a fuller biography sent by Mary Fern Souder from *Portrait and Biographical Album of McLean County, Ill.* (Chicago: Chapman Brothers, 1887) pp. 521-522.

Daniel Rose. Located on section 6, Cheney's Grove Township, "lies one of the prettiest homesteads in McLean County ..." Mr. Rose is a native of this State, born in Clark County, Sept. 6, 1846. His parents were Ira B. and Julia (Martin) Rose, the former a native of New York State, and the mother of Indiana. Ira B. Rose was born Oct. 6, 1805, spent his childhood and youth in his native State near the city of Rochester, and when about twenty years of age became a resident of Kentucky ... The subject of our sketch remained with his parents until the breaking out of the late war, and although only about sixteen years of age, enlisted ... Co. G, 123d Illinois Mounted Infantry ... he married, on the 7th of November, 1876, to Miss Rhoda E. Tudor who is a native of this county, born April 4, 1858. She is the daughter of Thomas H. and Sophia (Hunter) Tudor, the former a native of Madison County and the latter of Jessamine County, Ky. The mother of Mrs. Rose was born March 24, 1833 ... Daniel Rose came to McLean County in 1868, first locating at Funk's Grove ... he then rented for six years and at the expiration purchased 160 acres to which he subsequently added. His three children are as follows: Frankie was born Feb. 18, 1878, and died Jan. 19, 1879; Lora M. was born Nov. 10, 1880, and Charles E., Oct. 25, 1882 ... "The beautiful residence of Mr. Rose is handsomely lithographed on another page of this volume."

Member Joseph Benson Rose III provides this information: George Rose, son of Elisha⁶, Johannes⁵, Arie⁴, Evert³, Arie², Aldert¹ Roosa of Ulster County, New York, George was born 26 November 1799, Sullivan County, New York according to Nannie L. Fordyce, *The Life and Times of Reverend John Corbly and the John Corbly Family Genealogy*, 2nd, edn., revised by Leola Wright Murphy, rpt. (Knightstown, Ind.: Mayhill Publ., 1970).

Joseph Benson Rose (son of George), was born 23 October 1838, died 4 July 1902. He married, Florence Field of the Marshall Field family, Chicago. At the age of eighteen he went to New York City and arrived with only \$1.00; after a few years he became first president of Royal Baking Powder Company. When he died his son George II inherited about \$12,000,000.00 from the Royal Baking Powder sale and other investments (about \$12,000,000.00 in today's dollars). Joseph Benson Rose II spent his winters in Ocean Springs and the rest of the year divided between Long Island and Europe. He learned horsemanship at Meadow Brook Club on Long Island. Fox hunts, polo, and steeple chase were among the many events in which he participated. Sometime after his marriage to Eleanor (Connely) Mitchell, they relocated to the Island of Brioni in Italy. There JBR II was a member of the International Polo Clubs and competed in the tournament of 1926 or 1927. Still later they moved to Paris.

Member Benson Rose also sent some news articles. One, from *The New York Times* of July 29, 1905, is dated at Narragansett Pier July 28, and states that George Rose, on the yacht *Crescent*, sailed over from Newport with a party of five, whom he entertained at luncheon in the Casino.

In *The Polo Monthly* of September 1926: Savile Cups at Brioni. Playing at the Italian Polo Club on Brioni Island in the final for the Savile Cups, Mr. Campbell's Brioni team ... had an easy victory over the Sturgeons ... On the Sturgeons team, Mr. J. Benson Rose among others.

Editor's note: The above are descendants of Group T1 of the DNA study. These are members of the Dutch Roosa family (the family of our long-time DNA administration David Brown, now deceased).

Sandy Miller of West Virginia gathered many documents and photos of her Rose family. Here she shares her branch.

One branch of this family, Arthur Wellington⁴ Rose (John Crippen³, John², William¹), moved from New York to West Virginia to work in the mines. Arthur's son Edward Arthur Rose was born 10 December 1882 in Gary, McDowell County, West Virginia, and married on 28 December 1904 to Mary Etta Christian. They had several children: Aileen Cosby, Nettie Blanch, Aubry Willard, Arthur Mastin, Clowar Gillespie and Esther Annis. Edward died 27 December 1960 in Princeton, West Virginia, and is buried in the Oakwood Cemetery.

A Delayed Certificate of Birth for Edward #52639 was filed with the West Virginia State Department of Health and shows he was born on the above date and place. It also includes the notation that the marriage record was in Bland County, Virginia.

The obituary in its entirety: Edward Arthur Rose, 78, of Highland Avenue in Princeton, died at his home Tuesday. He was a retired Virginian Railway conductor, a member of the Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen, and a native of Gary. Survivors include one son, Clowers Rose of Princeton: three daughters, Mrs. Nettie Seivey, Mrs. Aileene Walker, and Mrs. Esther Morris of Princeton; one half-sister, Mrs. Blanche French of Bluefield; one brother, Willard Rose of Bluefield, Va.; 16 grandchildren; 18 great-grandchildren. Memorial Funeral Dictory of Princetin [sic, Princeton] is in charge of funeral arrangements, which are incomplete. [Name and date of newspaper unknown but he died 27 December 1960.]

For example, she wrote to her relative Stephen Rose about an RFB issue she received which had the Estate of her ancestor Peter (Gardner) Rose of Philadelphia and also a mortgage from John and Sally Mayhew and wife Salley 17 Sept 1831 for lots in St. Clairsville, Belmont Co. OH to Peter Rose Sen. ... Ellnora also noted in that issue a mention of deed P p. 338, Belmont Co. Ohio, an instrument of Peter Rose mentioning George Rose which implied a relationship between the two. She also spotted in the issue under "Some Philadelphia Estates" the listing of the Estate of her William Rose born 1754, twin of Stephen J Rose's Peter Gardner Rose. [Ellnora, an excellent researcher, doesn't miss much!]

Rose Klix #2840R02: "While I researched for my ancestors on a microfilm the library borrowed for me from the SD State Archives in Pierre. This film is of the *Hot Springs Weekly Star* from 1893-1898, this article caught my eye ... March 8, 1894 *Hot Springs Weekly Star* last page 3rd column reprinted an article from the Deadwood Times. Hills = Black Hills

"Bird Rose of the R. R. cattle company, and Ed. Lemmon of the Shiedly company have gone to Texas and Mexico to buy cattle for their range north of the Hills, and expect to get about 9,000 head. A law goes into effect on March 10, imposing a tax of \$2 per head on cattle shipped out of Mexico, and they are making haste to avoid the tax. Bird expects to be gone until June. - Deadwood Times"

Rose also sent: Mar 23, 1894 *Hot Spring Weekly Star* front page It's amazing what they put on the front page of the paper under Local News ... "Mr. Rose who keeps the Elkhorn hotel at Oelrichs, came over Friday to have a large carbuncle on the upper lip lanced. Dr. Wade did the job."
