John Hickman Rose and his wife Sarah Jane (Kirk) Rose, in Erath County, Texas around 1900. John was the son of Willliam W. and Lucinda (Hickman) Rose and grandson of Francis M. and Betty (Cutbirth) Rose of Giles County, Tennessee. Sarah (Kirk) Rose was the daughter of Isiah Kirk and Minerva Jane (Atkisson) Kirk of Webster County, Missouri. John and Sarah were the parents of seven sons.

Giles County, Tennessee Rose Family

The Francis M. Rose family of Giles County, Tennessee, from whom John Hickman Rose on the left descends, is an interesting family which is in Group C of the Rose DNA project. Others in the group include the families of

- William Rose (w. Martha) of York Co., Virginia and Johnston/Wayne Cos., North Carolina
- Thomas Rose of Sumter Co., South Carolina
- Samuel Rose of Madison Co., Kentucky
- James Rose of Claiborne Co., Tennessee and Grundy Co., Missouri

DNA does not however tell us how Francis M. Rose is connected to each of the above families. Though considerable research has been undertaken by different researchers in the past, the answers continue to elude the researchers. Anyone with knowledge of this family is urged to contact the Rose Family Association so that they can be put in touch with others seeking answers.

When we publish a listing from courthouses, such as grantor and grantee indexes, that information can be used to obtain a copy. You can either borrow the microfilm from the Family History Library in Salt Lake City through your local FHL library, or, you can use the Book and Page number in the listing to order a copy of the document from the courthouse. Address your letter to the department which handles that type of notice, such as, "Recorder of Deeds" if it is a land record, "Probate Department" if it is an estate record, or "Vital Statistics" if it is a birth, marriage, or death. It is best to ask for a quote for a photocopy of the whole document. (This is especially important in New York where some of the counties can charge very large "search" fees to look up the item, and large fees to photocopy each page.)

When requesting copies of military records, use the online forms at www.archives.gov to order those involving records at the National Archives.

Obtaining the actual documents can often provide additional information. They are also wonderful documents to pass on in the family.

We hope everyone had a good summer and are now ready to start researching again!

John A. Ladd, M.D. and wife Nancy F. Rose



John A. Ladd, M.D., was born October 29, 1830 at Andes, Delaware County, New York, son of John Ladd and Nancy McDonald. Dr. Ladd's earliest recollections are of his highest ambition to become a physician. He studied under Dr. J. R. Leal, and took courses at Berkshire Medical College, Pittsfield, Massachusetts. He went to Iowa, and located at Keokuk; after service in the Civil War he removed to Iowa Falls, and then to Buckingham, and again moved later.

He married at Toronto, Iowa, on December 30, 1860, to Miss Nancy F. Rose, a native of Ohio, who was born in 1841. Coming to Iowa with her parents when but six years of age, she spent her early life in Clinton County, where they located. By this marriage there are six children: Ossian D., the eldest; Anzonetta E.; Fred G.; John H.; Mabel wife of George T. Bourne; and Nannie G.

To get copies of any of the courthouse records write to the courthouse at the county seat. If it is a deed or land record, address it to "County Registrar of Deeds" and cite the document book and page. Be sure to mention that a quote is requested for the full document.

They are part of Record Group 15 of the National Archives and for the most part (with some exceptions) are not available on microfilm. To order the requestor must know the name of the pensioner, the act, and the date of death of the pensioner.

STEPHEN ROSE FAMILY

By Stephen C. Rose #0929R84.

The following is a brief summary of my Rose's starting with my great grandfather, Levi Benton Rose. The information is based on that handed down by my grandfather, Cecil Benton Rose, and father, Robert L. Rose.

Starting with my great grandfather, I am the 4th generation of my family to have worked in the upstream oil industry, that is to say, in exploration, development and production of oil and gas. We first started in our home state of Ohio as the industry moved east from Pennsylvania, then on to Oklahoma and Texas, then California and overseas. As my Grandfather used to say, "The oil business has been good to us Roses. Through all of the depressions, panics and recessions, we've always had a roof over our heads, food on the table and a fast car in the garage." I'm not sure that last applied to Levi but the rest of us have always liked fast cars!

My grandfather told the following stories about his father: Apparently, he was a wildcatter or oil explorationist starting in the 1870's. As the census shows him as a carpenter in 1870, I'm guessing that he started building wooden drilling derricks for other folk and moved on to doing for himself. Apparently, he was pretty successful and discovered a number of small fields. He supposedly had a run-in with John D. Rockefeller in Ohio. John D. had essentially cornered the market on railroad tank cars to transport the oil to eastern refineries. When

wildcatters found a new field, he would make them a fair offer to buy it. If they refused his offer, they quickly found out that they had no way to get their oil production to market. Levi discovered this the hard way. The second Rockefeller offer was considerably less than the first one. Thereafter, if Mr. Rockefeller made an offer, Levi took it! Eventually he moved on to Oklahoma (where Rockefeller didn't have a lock on the market) and continued wildcatting. By the time he died, he had spent just about the last of the several small (\$100,000-200,000) fortunes he had made. My grandfather was always resentful that at least some money had not been left to him. I have seen pictures of my great-grandfather working an early drilling rig with his cousin in the 1870's or early 1880's but these pictures were lost when a renter trashed my grandmother's house.

My grandfather started out working on the drilling rigs as shown in the picture. He followed the drilling "booms" in Oklahoma and Texas from the teens through the twenties and had a number of stories about his experiences. Cecil was also an excellent athlete, playing both semi-pro football and baseball. He moved on to help construct the first field gas processing plant built by Shell Oil in the 1930's in Texas (probably the western part). These are plants that process the raw gas and remove such liquids as propane and butane for sale separately from the dry gas that goes into the pipeline. He ended up in California in the early 1940's operating gas plants for Shell and retired in the town of Bellflower, between LA and Long Beach.

My father became very tired of moving with my grandfather. When Bob was about 13, he arranged to live at a friend's house and got a job as a soda-jerk in Yale, Oklahoma, near Stillwater. As my father was 6' 3" at that time and his father was only 5' 7" or so, my Dad won that argument! Dad and I were both early developers. He was 6'3" at barely 13 years old and I was 6' 2" at 13 ½ years old. He inherited his father's athletic skills, playing on the state champion football team his last two years and holding the state discus record for 20 years or more. He graduated from high school at the age of sixteen years and 3 months and entered the University of Texas the following fall. He joined the Sigma Chi fraternity there and apparently had a great time before he flunked out-not easy to do when you have an IQ measured at 157! After a year or so, he went out to California and attended Long Beach JC for a year. He went to the 1936 Olympics in LA, was friends with Johnny Weismuller



(1st Tarzan I think) and got good enough grades to get into Cal Berkeley. He obtained his degree in Geology, starting a family tradition of never finishing college in four years. I and my two siblings carried on with this tradition but my daughter broke it. She also went Phi Beta Kappa and graduated Magna Cum Laude from Dartmouth. Anyhow, Dad was the first of the Roses to get a college education although all of us since have done so. He married my mother, Shirley Douglas, whom he had met at Berkeley. Interestingly, when I got the genealogical data on both families, it turned out that they had lived in adjacent counties in Ohio in 1806-1810. It seems likely that, given the small number of settlers, that the two families might have known each other over a hundred years before my parents met some 2000 miles away. Dad started working after graduation for Western Geophysical, one of the first companies of this nature. I later knew one of it's founders, Josh Soske, when I was at Stanford and he passed along a few good

third largest domestic one in the Forties and Fifties. Dad ended up being the President and CEO of the company at age 44. He spent a lot of traveling as D&E had about 35 drilling rigs running in a dozen countries as well

as about 40-50 in the USA. D&E also had oil-producing properties and the owners decided to sell them off about 1961. Dad and another man (his CEO) were planning to buy the drilling side of the company



I moved around some when I was young but stayed mostly

in S. California near the beaches. I was born in Long Beach but we were living in Palos Verdes at the time. spent much of my youth in PV and Newport Beach. I ended up starting at Stanford in 1959 where I met my future wife during the Freshman Orientation

Week, before school actually started. We were at a campus organization's beer party when it got raided. Nancy and I were separated from the others as we were the only ones under 18 years old so all the others were contributing to our delinquency. They let us all off with a warning

but that's how we met. In keeping with the family tradition, I dropped out of school in 1962 and didn't finish my Petroleum Engineering BS until 1967. I then went to work for Atlantic Richfield (ARCO) in Corpus

ing in Texas and California over the next fourteen years. I also received my MS in Petroleum Engineering from Stanford in 1970. In 1981, I moved into operations management for AR-CO's Rocky Mountain District in Denver, CO. In 1987, I took a job as Vice President of Production Operations for ARCO Indonesia in Jakarta, Indonesia. Three years later, I became the head of another subsidiary, ARCO Bali North. We installed and produced a major gas field on an island north of Bali as well as overseeing the construction of a major sub-sea pipeline. This was a project worth about \$750 million and was the first gas development to sell gas to the Indonesian domestic market. In 1993, I was appointed to be the Development and Operations manager for ARCO's

Henry Thomas Rose is believed to be a son of John Rose, data unknown. Henry and his wife Jane had among their children a son Thomas Henry Rose born1812-13, who married Susan Ann Shelton. The latter's daughter Eliza Gordon Rose was born 8 September 1857, and married 13 June 1881 in Stafford County, Virginia to James Edward Armstrong. He was born

27 April 1859 in Stafford, and died 14 September 1938 in Fredericksburg, Virginia. Eliza died 7 August 1933 in Richmond, Virginia, and is buried also in Oak Hill Cemetery. They were members of the First Baptist Church in Fredericksburg. They had several children, among them Nellie Edith Armstrong who was born 12 August 1899, and by her first marriage to John Thomas Hearn Sr. had several children including daughter Virginia Gordon Hearn, member of the Rose Family Association. Virginia tells us that she studied at various institutions; her doctorial studies were at Nova University, Ft. Lauderdale, Florida. She has a certificate in Aging Studies, and a certificate in Non-profit Managemrent, both from VCU, Richmond, Virginia.

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oil development in the Amazon rain forest to be built without a road. The total area cleared in the forest is under 5 acres or so. I took early retirement from ARCO when this project became stalled. However, it was completed as designed and remains the minimum impact development in the Amazon. I'm very proud of the fact that this project as well as two other major developments that I was responsible for in the USA and Asia received national recognition for the protection the environment and the native populations as the consequence of the design and construction processes. Since I retired from ARCO, I worked as the Sr. Vice President for a smaller independent oil company in Houston for a couple years, operating mostly in West Africa. Subsequently, I have been working as a consultant for ARCO and other companies in South America, mostly in Venezuela.

My family, and, particularly my wife have graciously adapted to the peripatetic life of the itinerant oilman. Indeed, they have thrived on it most of the time although Midland, TX the second time was a bit much. My daughter spent her teenage years in Jakarta, going to a really fine international school. She claims that her experience there made Dartmouth a cinch! She is now married to a fine man, Mason Hart, and we have our first grandchild, Dylan Stephen Hart, who is of course the smartest and cutest baby around! They live in Houston, TX where Dylan was born on May 9, 2006. Kathy and her husband both work as technical writers. When we aren't going to Houston, Nancy and I spend our time in Taos, NM

during the winter and on Vashon Island in Puget Sound near Seattle during the summers.

Ellnora Rose Young #0409y81 tells us that her father Sam Rose died March 24, 2010, at the age of 95. He leaves a family with many memories. Sam was a descendant of the early Roses of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on whom Ellnora has worked faithfully for many years.
