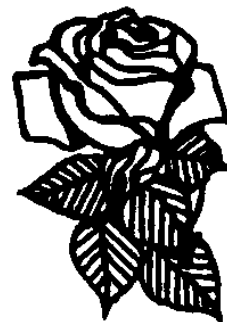

Nathan Rose Home in St. Paul, Minnesota



From a notecard of Summit Hill Association, 1908

Former home of Nathan Rose, this home is located in St. Paul, Minnesota

Member Cindy Torfin tells us that a couple of years ago a woman contacted her after hearing a story about the three Civil War brothers in St. Paul, Minnesota cemetery. She and her husband bought a house in St. Paul, and she knew that the house once belonged to a Nathan Rose. Though it was not her own Rose family, Cindy did research on this to send to the new owners. She found that the house belonged to Nathan S. Rose who was born in 1875 in Minnesota, and his wife Hortense. They lived there and had a family. Nathan was the son of Isodore Rose born in Bavaria and Isodore's wife Nannie, also born in Bavaria according to census records. Nathan Rose was a fur dealer and his father, Isodore, was also a fur dealer. Among the members of this family was an Isaac Rose.

The drawing on the notecard is from the "Summit Hill Association" when the house was on the house tour in 1908. The present address of the home is 857 Fairmont Avenue, St. Paul, Minnesota.

Dear Readers,

The Rose Family Bulletin started publication in 1966. In four more years we will reach the 50th anniversary! It hardly seems possible, but so much has been learned about the various Rose families during these years.



One of the tools that has helped many Roses is the Y-DNA project. After David Brown successfully used it to prove his own Rose line, Christine asked him to work with her on a project for the Rose Family Association. This was started in 2002. David did the analysis of the DNA, and Christine worked to contact people, explain the project, and to encourage testees to participate. Between the two the Rose project was built into almost 700 when David died, one of the largest of all Y-DNA projects,

After David died the Association asked the co-administrator who had been helping David to take over. That proved to be a mistake. She was very ambitious and longed to have total control of the project. It is a long story which is told in abbreviated form at our website at: www.RoseFamilyAssociation.com (use the DNA link there). The result is the unbelievable take over of the project by the testing firm and the administrator, all the while claiming that it was never a Rose Family Association project! Christine has ample proof in saved emails of the history and the fact that the testing company always knew this was a Rose Association Project. It has not stopped both the firm and the administrators from making unfounded and erroneous accusations while refusing to examine the evidence to the contrary. This is an unbelievable turn of events and because of this the Rose Family Association is no longer supporting the testing firm involved.

Members who know of the problem have suggested a variety of solutions: hire an attorney, contact an investigative reporter, start an independent project not tied to a particular firm by using the tests results accumulated as the basis, etc. There is also the route of doing nothing other than disassociating ourselves with the existing project. As to "good" news, it is summer and there will be many family reunions. Please take a photo of your Rose get-together to send for publication.

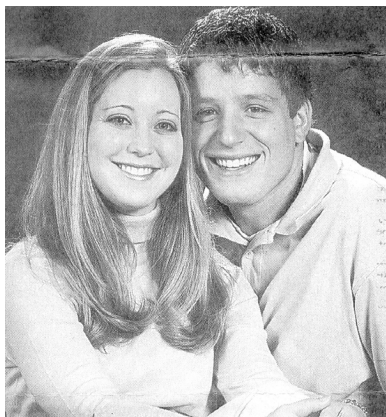

WAR OF 1812 PENSION

Abstracted at the National Archives by editor.

Citation: National Archives, Record Group 15, JACOB ROSE. #11180. wife Lydia, War of 1812 Pension.

Affidavit: Lawrence Co., Ky., 7 Mar. 1853, Mrs. Lydia Rose, resident of sd co., aged 70, widow of Jacob Rose, Priv. in company commanded by Capt. Gibbs, Reg. Tenn. Mil. Vol., applying under act of 3 Feb. 1853, had by Jacob Rose the following children: John Rose, Elizabeth Rose, Polly Rose, Levi B. Rose, Eberilla Rose, Jas. W. Rose, Robert Rose and Jesse D. Rose, all of whom were over 16 at time of passage. Signed: Lydia (her x mark) Rose. Wit.: D by her x mark.

Affidavit: Carter co., Ky., 23 Oct. 1858, Lydia Rose, aged 80, resident of Lewis Co., Ky., under act of June 3, 1858, widow of Jacob Rose, decd, Priv. in War of 1812, in battle at Pensacola, died some 30 miles from Fort Montgomery, resided in Lewis County 2 years last past and previously in Carter Co., her po is Olive Hill, Carter Co., Ky. Signed by her x mark. Appoints O. Phillips of Poplar Plains, Fleming Co., Ky. to receive her certificate.

Affidavit: Carter Co., Ky. 14 May 1859, affidavit of Lydia Rose, aged about 81, she made previous application from Carter co., Ky. because she lived near the county line between Carter and Lewis Counties, she lived in Carter co., Ky. in Dec. 1853, that her son James Rose and one --- Hatcher superintended the fixing up of the application, she doesn't know the names of officers, her son James Rose refuses the information because as she believes she won't let him manage the case, she removed from Green Co., Tenn. to Lawrence Co., Ky. and resided

there until Carter Co. was formed; resided in Carter until Dec. 1856, removed to Lewis County where she has resided since, she has no means of establishing her age, she knows of no family record, always been informed that her father was killed in the Battle of Kings Mountain and she was a little over 2 years old when he was killed; she informed that the battle was in the year 1780 and she would therefore be about 81 years old. Signed: Lydia (her x mark) Rose. We Henry Rose and Jesse Kesse reside Lewis Co., Ky., etc. Henry Rose states he is son of claimant [but note that he is not listed in two lists of children] and that she (Lydia Rose) has resided with him 30 years last past; Jesse Kesse acquainted with her for past 19 years. Signed: Henry Rose, Jesse (his x mark) Kesse. Harvey Henderson, J.P.

Affidavit: 14 Nov. 1853, Jas. W. Rose and Walter Osburn sign affidavit, of Lydia Rose, resident of Lawrence Co., Ky., under act of Feb. 3, 1853, widow of Jacob Rose, decd, Priv., Reg. Tenn. Mil., Capt. Gibbs, she married to said Jacob Rose 1 Sept. 1796, her husband died 7 Sept. 1814, account of sickness incurred in service in the state of Alabama, Mount Vernon; she has remained a widow, she married Burke Co., N.C. by Hickman Hensley J.P., her claim previously established by proof of William Ingram and Sarah his wife. Signed: Lydia (her x mark) Rose.

7 March 1853, appoints Geo. F. Hatcher of Louisa, Ky. attorney.

Affidavit: Lawrence co., Ky. 9 Mar. 1853, Samuel Liming and Alford Penington, that Mrs. Lydia Rose is widow of Jacob Rose, she had by Jacob Rose the following children, viz: John Rose, Elizabeth Rose, Polly Rose, Levi B. Rose, Eberella Rose, James W. Rose, Robert Rose, Jesse D. Rose, all of whom were over 16 at the passage of the act.

Mexican War Pension

Editor abstracted this at the National Archives in Washington D.C. These pension files have not been microfilmed at this time. Elihu E. Rose was a known son of John Rose of Washington County, Tennessee.

Affidavit: Greene Co., Ind. 16 Mar. 1888, Ellen A. Rose, resident of Bloomfield, her maiden name was Ellen A. Ellett, she married said Elihu E. Rose 14 Sept. 1847, six miles east of Bloomington in Monroe Co., Ind. by Dr. John Williams, M.G., she not previously married, he died at Bloomfield, 14 Apr. 1887, she remained widow, she born 21 Feb. 1826, was 62 on 21 Feb. 1888, he married to her under name Emery E. Rose. States that his real or full name was Elihue Embra Rose, commonly called Emory Rose. Signs name.

CC Mar. Rec.: Emery E. Rose to Ellen A. Ellett, Sept. 14, 1847, Monroe Co., Ind. Affidavit: John Williams, age 76, Clay Co., Ind., he acquainted since 1842 etc. Widow dropped 4 May 1898, death.

Affidavit: Greene Co., Ind. 19 Feb. 1887, Elihu E. Rose, 62 May 25, 1887, resident of Bloomfield said co., as Priv. and Sergeant, enlisted 30 May 1846, Bowling Green, age 22, 5' 8", dark hair, dark compl., blue eyes, discharge lost, signs name.

DESCENDANT OF ANDREW ROSE OF MERCER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA: MOUNTAIN VIEW CEMETERY, RAPID CITY, SOUTH DAKOTA



These photos from the Mountain View Cemetery are from member Rose Klix # 2840R02 who tells us that her infant brother's grave is in this cemetery, While she was visiting she noticed other Roses and took some photos including this one of Henry G. C. Rose Jan. 1841-August 1924 and Phebe A. Rose August 1854-January 1942. According to the 1910 Census of Pennington

County, South Dakota, he was 69 at the time, born Pennsylvania and both parents born Pennsylvania. Phebe A. was 50, born New York, father and mother born in Massachusetts. They were listed in Rapid Ward 1. There appears to be two stones for him.

Anyone seeking more information on him will find that there is a Civil War pension file at the National Archives, reference: HENRY G. C. ROSE. widow Phebe A. Rose. Co. G 39 Pa. Inf. 11 & 37 Co's 2 Battn. V.R.C. invalid filed 1880, application 372295, certificate 359105. widow filed 1924, application 1223332, certificate 960896, S. Dak. Remarks: XC-2715673. The XC number would indicate that the file may be now in the custody of the Veterans Administration. This can be determined by first seeking the file through the National Archives. They will advise if it is no longer in their custody.

Henry G. C. Rose was a son of Marcus Harrison Rose, and great-grandson of Andrew Rose of Mercer County, Pennsylvania. A Family Report on this family is available through the Rose Family Association. See listings at www.RoseFamilyAssociation.com, opening page.

George W. Rose served in the Civil War and had a pension file (National Archives, Record Group 15) cited as: GEORGE W. ROSE. widow Eliza W. Co. I 70 N.Y. Inf. invalid filed 1878, application 249893, certificate 234778. widow filed 1916, application 1083313, certificate 826505, N.J.

We published a summary of some papers of the file in the *Bulletin* March 1982. Now we have additional from the Certificate of Disability for Discharge: Corpl George W. Rose of Capt. James M. Longwell Co. J? of 1st Excels—Breede? Reg. of U.S. enl. By Capt. E. J. Ayers the First Reg. of Exch. Brigade at Paterson NJ on 7 May 1861 to serve three years; he was born at Goshen, O.C. [Orange County] in New York is Twenty one years Five feet Six ¼ inches, dark complexion, dark? Grey eyes, dark hair, by occupation when enlisted a Blacksmith. During the last two months has been unfit for duty 60 days having a rupture in the left side near the groin. Station: Camp Mahen VA. Discharged 18 Oct. 1862.

The Sea Serpent and Pilot Frederick Rose

We have a photocopy of an account of "The Sea Serpent Alleged to have Eyes like a Fish. And when life departed from his bulky hulk he sank with never a wink." The name of the person who sent it is not on the copy. It is from an account of "Seneca Lake Sea Monster" from a newspaper of Geneva, N.Y. July 15, 1889. "The Otetiani, a side wheel steamboat belonging to the Seneca Lake Steam Navigation company, officered by Captain Careleton C. Herendeen and Pilot Frederick Rose," when between Dresden and Willard Pilot Rose saw what appeared to be an overturned boat. He and the Captain examined the object with his glass. The lengthy account continues, saying that the object turned out to be a creature "displaying two rows of sharp, white teeth." They commenced an attack on the "creature" and finally, "lying close beside the steamer, with a gaping wound on its side, was the monster. It raised its head, gave what sounded like a gasp, and lay quiet. ...? While trying to haul it on board, the rope broke and they were compelled to let go or go overboard. The body sank and disappeared.

On pp. 241-242 of Christine Rose's *Descendants of Robert Rose of Wethersford and Branford, Connecticut Who Came on the Ship Francis from Ipswich, England in 1634*, published in 1983, there is the account of Seth⁶ (Roswell⁵, Elisha⁴, Jonathan³, Daniel², Robert¹). Among his children was a son



Roswell on whom we had nothing further at the time the book was published. Now descendant Mike Deming of Bayfield, Colorado, has filled us in with some details and photos. Siblings of Roswell Rose included Ambrose Rose b. ca 1824-25, Anna Rose, Milton Rose, Elisha D. Rose b. 1831 m. Mary M. Smith, Emeline Rose, and Harriet Rose.

From Mike Deming: Roswell Rose was born August 1833 in New York (still working on location, probably Broome, Schoharie Co., NY) the son of Seth Rose (254) and Sally (Sarah) Palmer. He spent most of his young years in La Porte Co. Indiana, possibly some other unknown locations, and moved to the Shawnee Co. Kansas area in 1857. I believe his older brother Elisha D. arrived

in 1858. Don't know when his brother Milton arrived. Roswell and Milton had adjoining farms. Roswell married Cynthia McCormick in 1865. They had 6 children, according to family history records.

1) Pearl Rose; birth and death unknown. died as a child.

2) Adelbert (Bert) Morris Rose, b: 1868 Kansas. Believe he lived into the 50's still tracking this one. My Dad went to visit him and brother Whitney in Oregon in 1939. He married Grace ? 1892. I have several pictures of him and his wife Grace taken in the 1940's and probably early 50's.

3) Whitney Rose; b: 1870 Kansas. died 1940 in Clackamas Co. Oregon. married Sadie F. ? (b: 1875) they had two children; Donald W. and Grace E. (the girl in the family picture I sent you, is not Grace, but Margory). My father believes she was adopted).

4) Lewis Harvey Rose; b: 1876, Kansas. died 1955, Kansas. Married Esther A. Lawton (1876-1966). they had two children; Louis D.; b;-1914 and Wilma M., b: 1919. Lewis is the one I mentioned who accidentally shot and killed his mother Cynthia in 1892. He and his wife took care of Rowell in his older years and stayed on the old homestead.

5) Nellie G. Rose ; b; 1880 Kansas. died 1967 Summit Co., CO. (my grandmother). She married John James Deming Christmas Eve 1902 in Frisco, CO. She left Kansas in July 1902 to visit her brother Whitney who was an electrician at a Frisco, CO mine, arriving Frisco July 3. She passed much of the family history, including pictures and other items to my Father as did her younger



sister Mabel. I remember her telling many old stories of early Kansas and my Great Aunt Mabel also told us many stories of Kansas and of Seth Rose. The Demings

had 7 children I will not list here, but if you want them I'll send along. My Father H. P. Deming was the youngest, born in 1918. He is still living and is very interested in my genealogy searches of our family. He has kept most all the old documents, pictures and wrote some of the Rose and Deming family history back in the 60's prior to Nellie passing away. Nellie's husband John died in 1920 leaving her with seven children to raise and \$400 worth of raw ore from his gold and silver mine.



6) Mabel Rose; b: 1883 Kansas. died 1976 in Clackamas, Oregon. Married Ernest Bartram; b: 1883. date of marriage unknown, but was in Kansas. They had two children that are in our history records; Edith; b: 1908 and Harvey; b: 1911. The Bartram family left Kansas between 1910 and 20 for Montana and went to Oregon sometime after 1930.

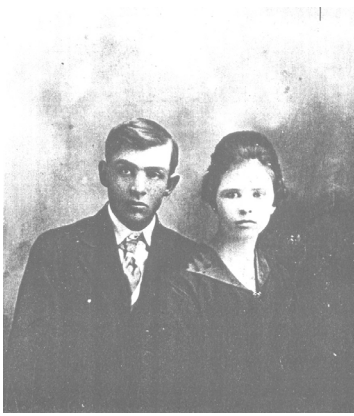

REPORT:

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the petition of Susannah Rose, widow of Benjamin B. Rose, a revolutionary soldier, have to report:

That the petitioner prays for a renewal to her of the pension allowed to her husband during his wife. It appears from her petition and other papers that she was married to Benjamin B. Rose in the year 1806; and there is no law granting pensions to widow of revolutionary soldiers who married subsequently to January 1, 1800. Leaving to the Senate the question as to the expediency of amending the existing law, the committee ask to be discharged from the further consideration of the petition.

JEREMIAH ROSE

HENDERSON COUNTY, ILLINOIS; MAINE

An account of him was published in the Henderson County *Graphic Reporter*, Stronghurst, Jan. 5, 1861 according to a handwritten note on it.

"The county history says Jeremiah Rose was born at Charleston in what later became the State of Maine. The date of his birth is not given but his age is given as in the nineties when he passed away here in Oquawka. It states also he lived about three miles east of Bangor, Maine most of his life.

"Mr. Bigger came to the Van Dine home across from the grade school on the west blacktop in Burnside after the above was typed and brought a report on the Jeremiah Rose grave in Oquawka cemetery at Oquawka. He found this veteran on the Rose family lot in the old section of the cemetery.

"Oquawka people acquainted with the Rose lot will recall there is a tall marble shaft monument of about a hundred years back with the names of about all the people buried on the lot on it and small marble slabs at each grave with merely the first names on them. The Jeremiah Rose inscription shows he died January 3, 1858 aged 91 years, 8 months, and 19 days.

"This is undoubtedly the correct date. The family would be expected to know when this death took place. The incorrect date of the county history given above no doubt may be accounted for by the fact the history was written a quarter of a century later and someone in the family may have tried to supply the date on this from memory without going to the records or monument.

"This veteran was born some time in 1766 according to the age at the time of his death given on the monument. He must have been one of the youngest men to serve in our army in the Revolution. He would have been fifteen a few months before Yorktown. This in the fall of 1781 was about the last fighting of the War.

"In the Revolution and the wars of the era of the early republic recruiting officers asked but one question of candidates for our armed service. That was "Can you do a day's work." That was the main question anyway. Males from the edge of boyhood to eighty were taken into the service.

"This man was probably large for his age and they were no doubt short of men and decided he would do for something at least. In some of our early wars when no check was made on ages, boys sometimes added a few years to their age to get in and took them off again when they got back home after the war. This boy must have done that and told the Army he was eighteen instead of what he actually was.

"Local authorities sometimes fed in boys and old men and unemployed unemployables to get them off the streets and to save the good men of the community from having to go and face British rifle and artillery fire in battles and be killed, this when the Governor called out the militia for a few months service at the front. This man may have been in an outfit like that where it wasn't even necessary to be able to do a day's work.

"Whatever he was in he got into the War so late it is not likely he saw much action if any at the Front. The Walker book does not list him but probably no one but Mrs. Brook has ever noticed the mention in the county history of him dying here while on a visit and being interred here."

Graham Rose of Marshall County, Indiana

The account of the portrayal of Graham Rose (born 1853) at the site of the Pleasant Hill Cemetery in Bourbon, Indiana on October 3, 2004 was provided by Roland Young. This annual cemetery walk is sponsored by the genealogical society as a history tour. In this, "Graham" "tells" that he was born October 20, 1853 to Orrin and Mary E. (Garrison) Rose. He gives information about his marriage in 1876 to Christina Schroeter, and adds data on their children.

In attempting to trace this family, it appears that it is highly likely that Orrin Rose is the son of Oliver⁶ and Lucy (Steele) Rose of the Robert¹ Rose family of Connecticut. (See Christine Rose, *Descendants of Robert Rose Who Came on the ship Francis etc...* 1983.) One of

the most compelling reasons for this belief is the appearance in the 1860 census in Marshall County of Lucy Rose who fits as the Lucy Steele who married Orrin Rose. Additionally, Lyman Griffin of Marshall County, Indiana made an affidavit in the War of 1812 pension file of Oliver Rose. We are hoping at some point to get a Y-DNA test from a descendant of Orrin Rose to confirm that a connection to the Wethersfield group is indeed a fact!

In 2006 my brother Jim agreed to a DNA test. We learned he matches those descended from Robert Rose of Branford, Connecticut. It's wonderful to learn which Roses to trace, but also frustrating to still have broken links. This narrative will honor my brother's life, but also may help us locate the straight path to our ancestors. What follows is a brief review of my brother's life events, his descendants, and known ancestors.

Jim's first winter was spent in a "turkey shed" converted into living quarters on the Knapp ranch in Wall, Pennington, SD where his father Harmon Lee Rose worked as a ranch hand. His mother Evelyn (Swinehart) Rose took Jim off baby formula, because they couldn't get through the Blizzard of '48 to the store by horseback. Luckily there were milk cows available. Harmon had earned enough to buy some cattle for his own herd, but lost them in the storms when they wandered over the "wall of the Badlands." Ranch life ended and the family moved back to Rapid City where Harmon had apprenticed with his brother Henry Fredrick Rose in a welding shop and also learned plumbing by working with his brother-in-law Donald Cline. Later Harmon drove truck for the Pennington County Highway Department and joined the

SD National Guard where he worked as a mechanic until his retirement.

After graduating from Rapid City High School in 1966, Jim

registered for the draft and volunteered to serve in the Navy. While waiting to be inducted, he worked as a guide at Wonderland Cave in the Black Hills. During the Viet Nam era, he served as a Data Systems Technician on the USS *Intrepid* which patrolled the Asian and Vietnamese waters before putting into port in Philadelphia, PA.

Maureen "Jean" Boilard was working in Phillie when she met Jim. They were married in her hometown of Portland, Maine on January 24, 1970.

Together Jean and Jim raised three boys (Chris, Steve, and Ken) until their divorce in 1973 when Jean returned to Portland, Maine with the boys. Christopher William Rose lives and works in Russia. He has one son Timofea Christopherovich Rose. Stephen Paul Rose lives and works in Portland, Maine. Steve has three daughters, twins

Caitlin and Sareaha, and Felisity. Kenneth Edward Rose lives in Florida, has a daughter Heather, and two sons Brian Kenneth and Enrique. Jim also fathered James Matthew Roseland who lives in Rapid City. James gave Jim even more grandchildren, Marie Ann, James Matthew, Jr, Bailee, and Riley Orion Roseland.

Jim and his four sons were reunited in Las Vegas, NV in the mid-1990s. After serving in the navy for seven years, Jim worked as a brakeman for the Burlington Northern Railroad for about ten years between Edgemont, SD and Gillette, WY. His next career was as a truck driver for several trucking firms, including Swift, Werner, and Crete. He used the

CB handle "Casey Jones." Jim was in the process of retiring when he passed away suddenly of heart failure.

By burying his remains in the Rose Family Cemetery, Pedro, Pennington County, SD, Jim lies near his parents Harmon Lee and Evelyn (Swinehart) Rose, his grandparents, John Frederick and Gertrude Grace (Olmstead) Rose, and his great-grandparents Henry Freeman and Mary Jane (Hocum) Rose, numerous aunts and their husbands, an uncle and his wife and several cousins. Jim's great-great grandparents Freeman Henry and Jane (Bailey) Rose are buried in the Hillside Cemetery in Oelrichs, Fall River County, SD.

We are still researching more information on Freeman Henry and Jane (Bailey) Rose's ancestors. Freeman Henry Rose was born about 1815 perhaps in Rose, Wayne, New York. His wife Jane Bailey was reportedly born in England. The couple was perhaps married May 3, 1838 in Woodhouse, Norfolk, Ontario, Canada. He may be the Freman (Freeman) Rose in the 1840 census records of Chicago Ward 2, Cook County, IL. It is believed he

is listed as a wagonmaker in the Chicago City Directory in 1843. This family was found in the 1855 census of Kenosha, Kenosha County, Wisconsin; and there again in the 1860 federal census. This is the first mention of other children besides Henry Freeman Rose b. in Chicago. (Mary Elizabeth (Rose) m. Marvin H Bacon, Talmon S (J?) Rose m. Susan E. Brown, Albert Rose m. Laura J.

Bienemann; Eliza Rose; and Hannah M. Rose). Freeman and Jane Rose also appear on the 1870 census in Avon, Rock, Wisconsin federal census with a George Ross (Rose?) family and father James Ross (Rose?). In 1880 Jane (Bailey) and Freeman Henry Rose appear on the federal census in

South Creek, Dixon, Nebraska and again there on the 1885 Nebraska census. On the same page is a James T (Talmon James?) and Susan (Brown) Rose family and a William H Pomeroy family. Note that other researchers related to Robert Rose also include Pomeroy's in their lineage. Dixon, Nebraska is very close to Sioux City, Woodbury County, Iowa where Freeman's son Henry Freeman Rose family was found in 1880 and son John Frederick Rose and siblings (Lelia and Myrtle Sylvia Rose) were born there. I have a copy of a deed whereby Freeman Henry and Jane (Bailey) Rose deeded their property in Oelrichs, Fall River County, South Dakota to their son Henry Freeman Rose 7 Mar 1893. There is reference to Freeman and Jane Rose in the book "Shadows of the Butte" about residents in Oelrichs, SD.

We would welcome any information about Freeman Henry and Jane (Bailey) Rose's ancestors or descendants to help us in our search for the links back to Robert Rose of Branford, CT.

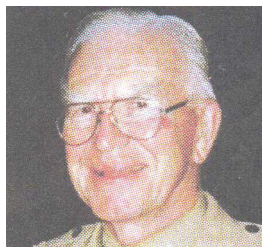

Joy Lahmer sent an item from a Louisville, Kentucky newspaper listing deaths of soldiers who died in the General Hospital there during the week of June 6, 1862. The newspaper had been used as wallpapere on a home in Fleming Co., Ky. Included: June 2nd: ... James H. Rose, Co. B, 13th Kentucky.

Floyd K. Legan Jr. #81L0450L81 sent some interesting information about Leonard J. Rose of California. We have mentioned him before in past issues and published his photo. He was a native of Bavaria and though accounts vary as to where he first lived, this article says he immigrated to New Orleans with his family when he was 12. In 1857 he and his wife Amanda and their two children struck out for California with a party he organized. They were attacked by Indians along the way with a loss of life and supplies. In 1860 he purchased part of the Randho Santa Anita and named it "Sunny Slope Farm." His vineyard there made him prominent, and eventually he became a Senator.
